

World War 1 Roll of Honour

Birmingham City Police

PC B146 Thomas NUNNEY

Lance Corporal P 2671 Military Mounted Police

Thomas was born 29th August 1883 in Hartlebury, Worcestershire and as resident of 52 Lorne Street, Stourport with his father Isaac

25th January 1901 Thomas served as a private 4978 in the 10th (Prince of Wales Own) Hussars for eight years. He served in South Africa 1901 to 1902

23rd May 1910 Thomas joined Birmingham City Police as a reservist and a railway goods porter, he was issued with warrant number 7791 and posted to the A division with the collar number PC A52

15th November 1915 Thomas resigned to join HM Forces, serving in the Military Mounted police

3rd February 1915, Thomas arrived in Salonica

2nd June 1919, Thomas re-joined the Birmingham City Police from HM Forces and was issued with a new warrant number of 9023

27th July 1920, Thomas married Beatrice Maria Knee, who was born in 1890 in Gloucestershire, they had their first child Charles Thomas on 12th February 1922. Birmingham City police records show a son Stanley was born 12th February 1936

1st February 1932 Thomas transferred to the B Division with collar number PC B146

14th October 1936 Thomas retired aged 53 years on a police pension of £165 4s 8d per annum

15th June 1956 Thomas sadly died at home, at 45 Colville Road, Sparkbrook, Birmingham. His funeral took place on 20th June at Yardley crematorium. Officers from B and F divisions acted as bearers

5th March 1960 Thomas's widow Beatrice, who still residing at 45 Colville Road, died at Selly Oak Hospital leaving £738 6s 10d to Charles Thomas, a progress clerk

March 1978, Thomas's son Charles Thomas died
